
OUR VALUES

2021-2024

1. Expand sustainably.eco to other geographic areas.

2. Facilitate a Youth Climate Ambassadors working group that discusses imminent issues and reports on their findings.

3. Organize an annual tree planting project for sustainably.eco members

4. Promote local de-paving projects

5. Work with the City of Kingston to increase "pedestrian zones" in the downtown core during the summer months.

6. Host community forums and moderate discussion on key issues facing the community.

7. Create a Sustainable Kingston Knowledge Centre filled with data compiled from sustainably.eco users that depict the values shared by our collective community.

8. Support Kingston City Council in showing leadership on Climate Action by actively participating in both the adaptation and mitigation technical teams for the City Climate Leadership Plan.



THE 2021 KINGSTON CLIMATE CHANGE SYMPOSIUM

The 2021 Kingston Climte Change Symposium was held online in response to the global pandemic. 456 participants registered to attend with another 710 viewing the event live on Youtube and another 946 views throughout the year. Speakers included Severn Cullis-Suzuki (David Suzuki Foundation), David Phillips (Environment Canada), Lori Nickel (Second Harvest), and Henrique S. Benites (UNSW Sydney).

2021 Climate Change Symposium Participant Poll

- 97 individuals completed the poll posted at the end of the Symposium
- 97 per cent said they were very satisfied or satisfied with the speakers. The majority indicated, Very Satisfied.
- 98 per cent said they were satisfied or very satisfied with the technology.
- 86 per cent were satisfied or very satisfied with the emcee (13. 4 per cent were very unsatisfied, unsatisfied or neutral about the emcee)
- 98.9 per cent were very satisfied or satisfied with the event (majority indicated very satisfied). Only 1 person was "neutral". None were unsatisfied or extremely unsatisfied.
- 100 per cent would attend another virtual event, like the symposium.



The sustainably.eco program is about connecting people who care to businesses that are making a measurable difference in sustainability..

In 2021, the sustainably.eco program grew to include 58 business members who have reduced a collective 22,554 tonnes of carbon.

Energy Services

Red Squirrel Conservation Services and Sustainable Kingston have joined forces in an asset-transfer, which will expand the organization's scope and help further reduce greenhouse gas emissions throughout Southeastern Ontario.

Continuing to operate under the name Sustainable Kingston, the newly expanded organization will now provide Home Energy Evaluations and support enrollment in the Canada Greener Homes Grant as well as the Enbridge Home Efficiency Rebate.



2022 will see Sustainable Kingston undergo significant growth that will expand our services and increase our capacity. Through our asset transfer with Red Squirrel Conservation Services, Sustainable Kingston now has the staff and expertise to provide Sustainably.eco members with additional services that will help them further reduce their carbon emissions.

By facilitating funding opportunities for Sustainbly.eco members, homeowners, and residential developers, Sustainable Kingston will play an essential role in decarbonizing Kingston and the surrounding area. Specifically, we will support applicants to Enbridge Gas Rebate program, Canada Greener Homes, and Better Homes Kingston through our Energy Services program.

We will continue to work with community organizations and businesses engaged in climate action as Sustainable Kingston works to be a key hub of information and hope in the fight against Climate Change. To achieve this, we will foster participation from our community through volunteer events such as Depave Paradise, Pitch In, and the Kingston Climate Change Symposium. By doing so, we hope to engage members of the community in sustainable initiatives while helping to further develop pride in the region we call home.
