- To date, businesses in Green Economy Hubs have collectively reduced **200,000 tonnes** of GHGs the equivalent of taking over **42,000 cars** off the road for one year.

Climate Action

Trailhead, the Tea Room, and Stone Mills Cleaning Services offset their carbon emissions by planting trees.

Tara Natural Foods implemented a refrigerator heat capture project. Tara has significantly lowered its use of natural gas by 57% since baseline year.



Climate Action (continued)

MacKinnon Brothers Brewing created a cold cellar by blasting away limestone bedrock which means that 80% of the year they don't need to use any additional cooling methods

KFHC Upgraded over 300 new stove ranges with Safe-T-Elements, saving 166 kWh per stove each year.



Living Wage

Weller Pharmacy, Stone Mills Cleaning Services, and Channel 3 Communications are Living Wage Certified.

This increases employees' quality of life, reduces poverty, and strengthens the community.



Food Recovery

Many sustainably.eco members partner with the local food rescue program.

From October 22, 2018 - February 24, 2019 Queen's Hospitality Service provided 5,071 meals to the community.
